

Trade Academy Animal Care Levels 2 and 3

Trades Academy programmes are for current secondary school students, who study one or two days a week over three or four terms and gain credits towards NCEA. The learning is practical and hands-on, using industry standard equipment and technology relevant to the animal care technology sector. Students develop the foundation skills needed to progress to further study, or move directly into employment.

Animal Care (Equine) Level 3

This foundation course covers all the relevant health and safety aspects of animal care and is the prerequisite to our level 5 Rural Animal Technology programme. Choosing the Equine strand will provide you with the skills to care for horses in a safe manner. You could find work in a variety of industries like racing, show-jumping and horse trekking.

Animal Care (Companion Animals) Level 3

This foundation course covers all the relevant health and safety aspects of animal care and is the prerequisite to our level 5 Veterinary Nursing Assistant programme. Choosing the Companion Animals strand provides you with the skills to care for dogs, cats, rabbits and all sorts of pets. You could end up working at the SPCA, a pet shop, boarding kennels, pet groomers and more – the options are endless!

Rural Animal Technician Level 5

If you love working with animals and want to make large animals your speciality, then this course takes you to that next level. This programme covers large animal anatomy and physiology, breeding and feeding, health and wellbeing along with many other tasks that will allow the graduate to work as a technician in conjunction with a veterinarian.
